



Purpose

This statement provides information about how the Royal College of Music processes personal data for students registered on the College's degree and diploma programmes, for visiting exchange students and for students attending the International Placement module as part of the degree programme offered at the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts.

The lawful basis for obtaining and using your personal data

The Royal College of Music (RCM) needs data in order to fulfil its contractual obligations to its students to deliver the education for which they have applied and to participate fully in the services offered to students.

The legal bases for the RCM to process your data are where:

Processing is necessary for the performance of a contract with the data subject or to take steps to enter into a contract

or

Processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation

or

Processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller.

Where did your data come from?

The information you provided when you applied for a place at the RCM forms the basis of your student record, either via UCAS Conservatoires or direct to the RCM, or, in the case of visiting exchange students, via the AEC online application system. For students from the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts, Boston University or Princeton University,
